# VSAS Survey Report: October 2021

# Summary

After a year-long hiatus, Volunteer Seabirds at Sea (VSAS) survey teams returned to the west coast of Scotland this month. Surveys were carried out from the decks of the Kennacraig to Islay and the Ardrossan to Brodick crossings. Data were collected to European Seabirds at Sea (ESAS) standards, by trained volunteers, using the JNCC VSAS app to digitally capture data in real time.

Environmental conditions were challenging for both surveys, and those experienced on the Arran survey were unsuitable for collecting high quality data, so observations from that survey are not shown here. The first leg of the Kennacraig to Islay route was used as a refresher so only the return survey is shown below, however it's worth noting that a white-tailed eagle was spotted towards the mouth of West Loch Tarbert during the refresher survey.

# Routes

## Kennacraig to Islay, 9th October 2021

A total of 99 observations were made of 12 seabird species (and three 'species groups' where identification could not be made to species level) during dedicated survey effort. No marine mammals were observed. Numbers of observations and total numbers of birds recorded are presented below (Table 1).




Fig 1. Auk observations recorded during the Kennacraig-Islay survey, 9th October 2021




Fig 2. Gannet & shag observations recorded during the Kennacraig-Islay survey, 9<sup>th</sup> October 2021




Fig 3. Small gull observations recorded during the Kennacraig-Islay survey, 9th October 2021




Fig 4. Large gull observations recorded during the Kennacraig-Islay survey, 9th October 2021




Fig 5. Seaduck & diver observations recorded during the Kennacraig-Islay survey, 9<sup>th</sup> October 2021
