Occupancy for Habitats Regulations Reporting 2019–2024**

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Summary


This document presents a visual summary of the natural and urban breeding occupancy of Herring Gull and Lesser Black-backed Gull in the UK. Distribution maps were derived from the Seabirds Count census of Britain and Ireland undertaken between 2015–2021 (Burnell *et al.* 2023). Distribution is mapped at a 10 km² resolution.

Distribution is colour-coded as follows.


- Green squares: Natural breeding areas (coastal and inland)
- Black squares: Urban breeding areas (nests on human-made structures)
- Blue squares: Areas with a combination of natural and urban nesting sites
